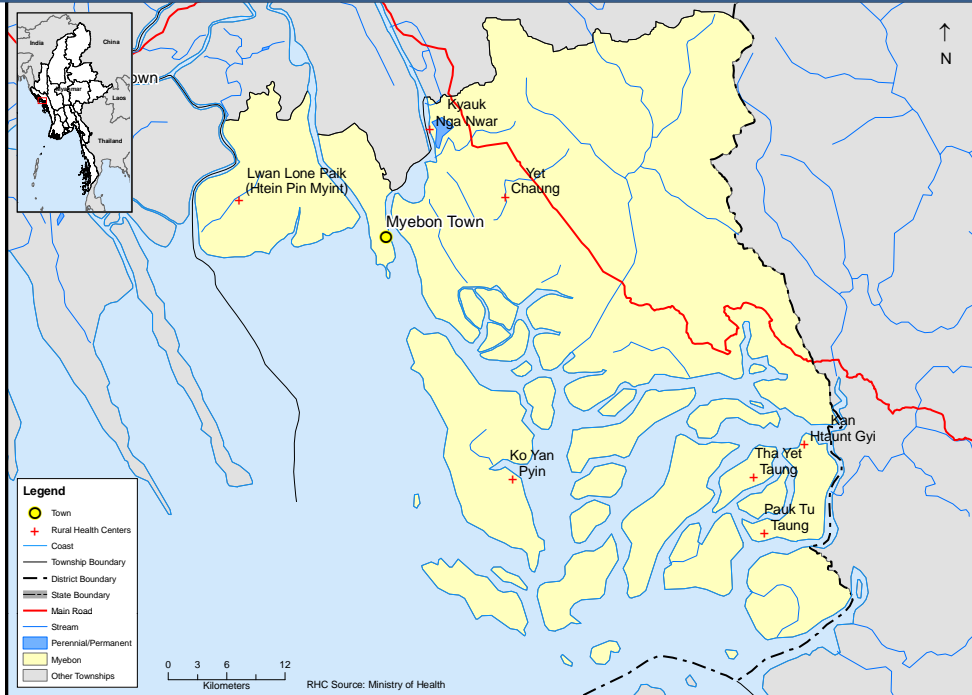

Livelihoods

The local population relies on 3 main livelihoods, prioritized as agriculture, fisheries and casual labor. Monsoon paddy is the main crop. Winter crops and double crops are also cultivated in some areas. The Fisheries sector follows as the second main livelihood, the area being endowed with creeks and rivers. Catching fish, prawn and crab is a common source of livelihood for the poor. The Livestock sector stands as a supplementary activity, especially for the landless/poor. Casual laborers live on farm work and timber extraction.

Priority Sectors

Sectors	Activities	Comments
Agriculture & Livelihoods	Embankment renovations, Agricultural inputs and Fisheries	Paddy yield is limited due to soil infertility, especially salt intrusion. Lack of awareness in the use of fertilizers and lack of paddy seeds in the coming year. Demo farms and fertilizer usage promotions are essential for the rehabilitation of the agricultural sector.
Shelter	Housing	More durable shelters are needed.
WASH	Water facilities/ Safe water supply/ Sanitation	Pond rehabilitation, dam construction and spring catchment are key WASH activities of agencies. Pond protection (fencing) is also important for the rehabilitation of the WASH sector. Latrine usage and household latrine construction still need to be improved.

Humanitarian Concerns/Issues

Water shortages were addressed as agencies are distributing water to villages affected by water shortages and as the rainy season is coming. Rehabilitation of Agriculture and Fisheries are key activities of many agencies. The need for durable shelters is becoming a major concern as the rainy season is coming up.

Priority Sectors and Humanitarian Concerns/Issues were identified in consultation with UNDP (HCU) and Humanitarian agencies in General Coordination Meetings in Myebon township.
