




## **Under WASH cluster partner management:**

- 1. 210 students have access to functional water points in temporary learning spaces and child friendly spaces
- 2. 2,450 students have access to functioning school latrines
- 3. 50 people have access to functioning latrines in temporary health care facilities
- 4. 33,456 people have received regular hygiene promotion, regular hygiene promotion sessions are decreased to adopt social distancing and to avoid crowded people in the camps as part of covid-19 prevention














2. Total 2394 latrines repaired in Q2 3. Total 1324 emergency Latrines set up in Q2 4. 150 Number of functioning children latrine reported
