

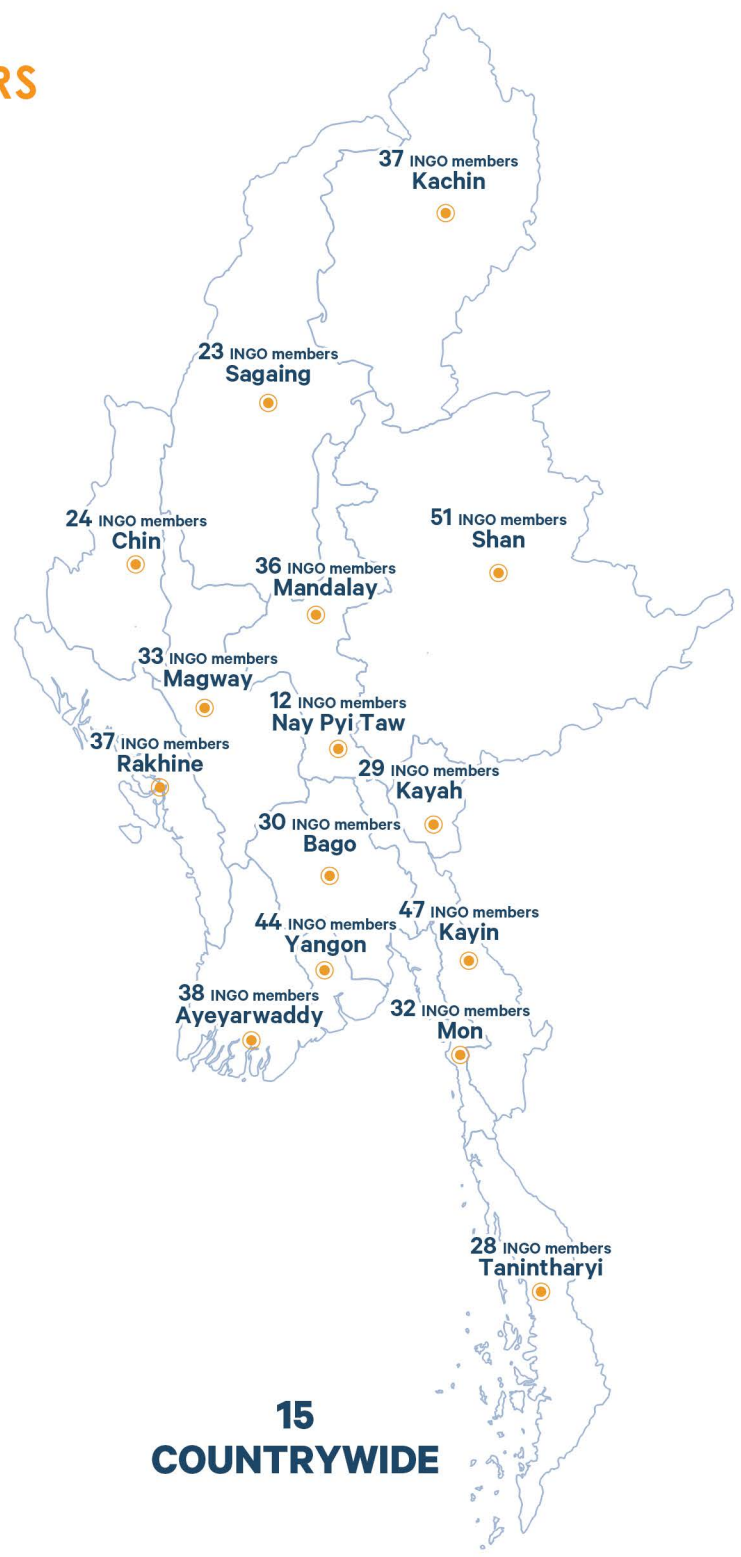
# INGO FORUM MEMBERS' COLLECTIVE IMPACT IN MYANMAR

## HOW INGO FORUM MEMBERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

In Myanmar, international non-governmental organisations (INGOs) support development efforts and help people affected by humanitarian crises. The INGO Forum Myanmar is a coordination platform that aims to bring together members of the Myanmar INGO community to build better partnerships, and to improve the coordination, effectiveness and coherence of humanitarian relief, development aid and peace building in the country. Founded in 2007, the INGO Forum currently has 115 INGO member organisations.

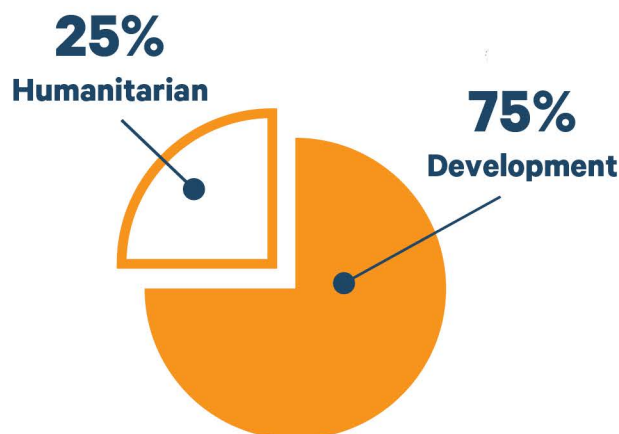
## GEOGRAPHICAL REACH

INGO Forum members work in all States and Regions of Myanmar on humanitarian, development and peace activities. The map shows the areas in which the members are active.



## PROGRAMMING FOCUS

INGO Forum members respond to both humanitarian and development needs on a contextual basis. Several members are also active in peace building activities.

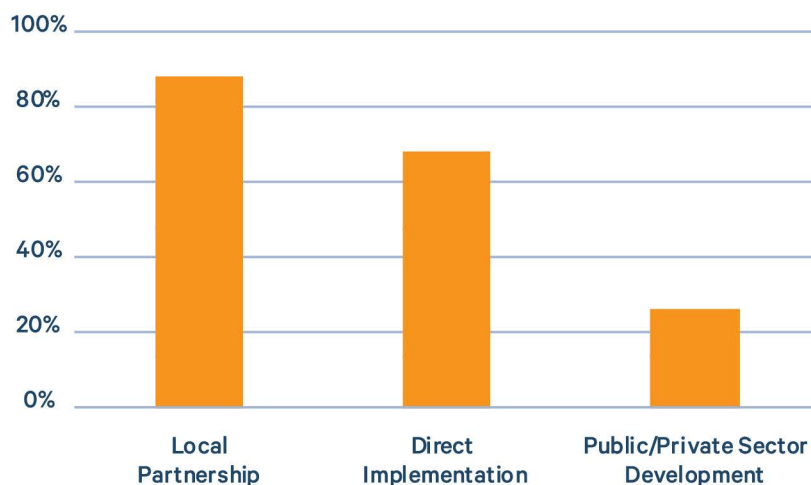

## TYPES OF IMPLEMENTATION MODE

When implementing projects, the majority of INGO Forum members choose to leverage local partnerships, although they also use two other modes of implementation. Some members use a combination of different implementation modes depending on the nature of the project.



## WORKING WITH LOCAL PARTNERS

At least **50%** of the INGO Forum members are working with **3-10 local partners** and **15%** of the members work with more than **25 local partners** in programs such as governance, health, education and agriculture.

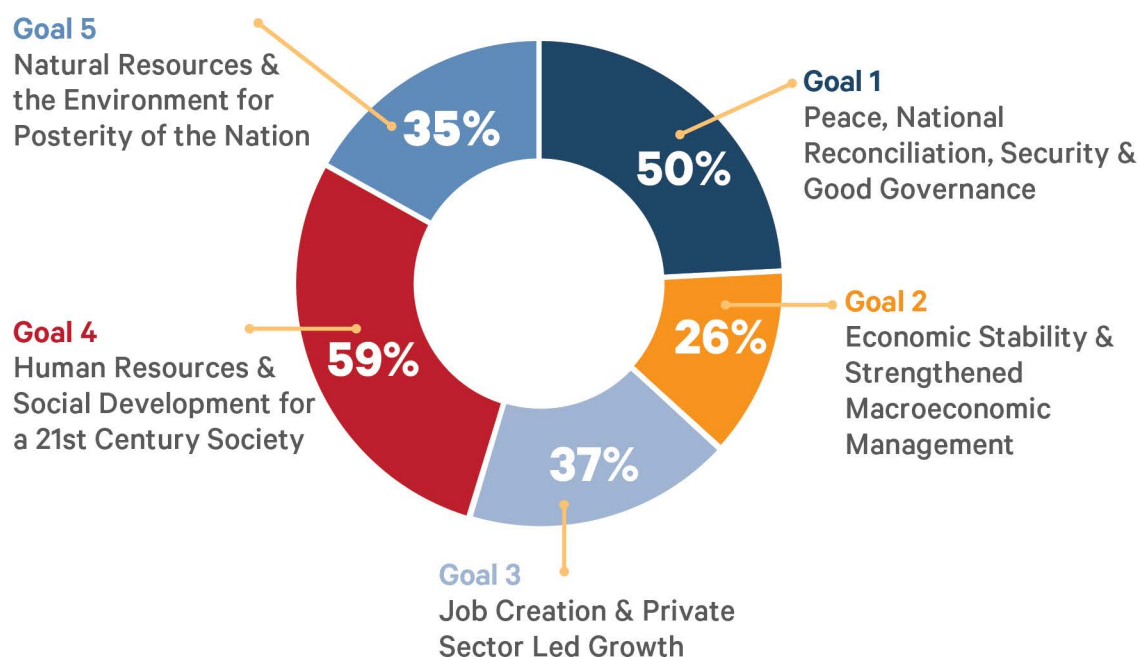
## IMPLEMENTING PROJECTS WITH THE PRIVATE SECTOR

**52%** of the INGO Forum members implemented projects in collaboration with at least **TWO organisations** from the private sector.
