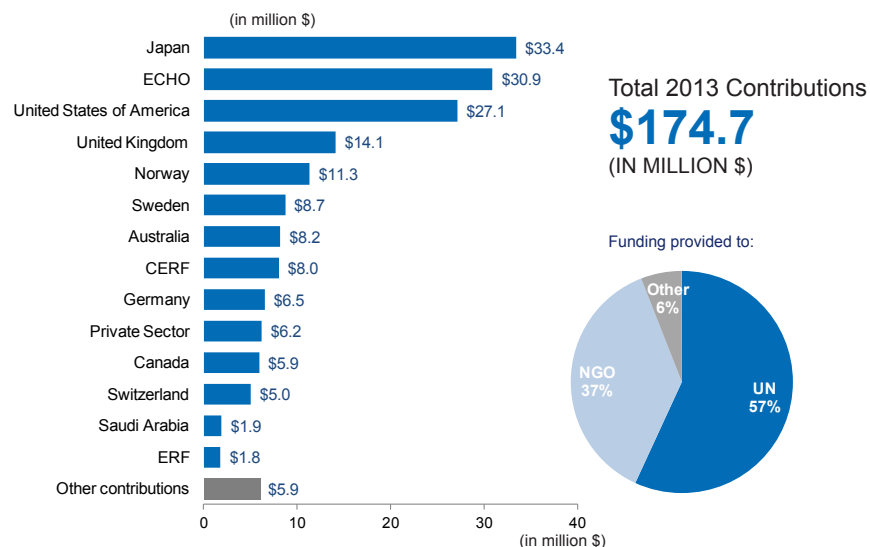


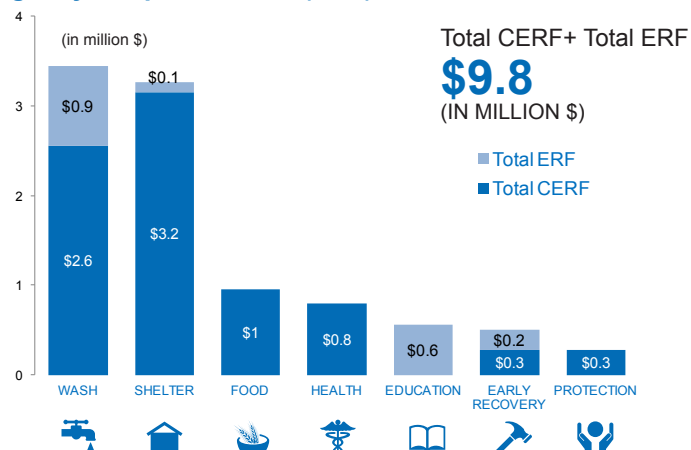
MYANMAR: Humanitarian Funding Update (31 December 2013)

In 2013, the United Nations and partners appealed for **\$160 million** for the humanitarian response in Rakhine and Kachin states. Funding enabled aid agencies to provide assistance to 180,000 displaced and vulnerable people in Rakhine State, who remain affected by the inter-communal violence that broke out in June 2012. In Kachin, 100,000 internally displaced people (IDPs) and 20,000 people in communities hosting IDPs, needed relief in 2013 as a result of ongoing conflict. Funds were also used to support durable solutions for affected communities, and to build resilience.

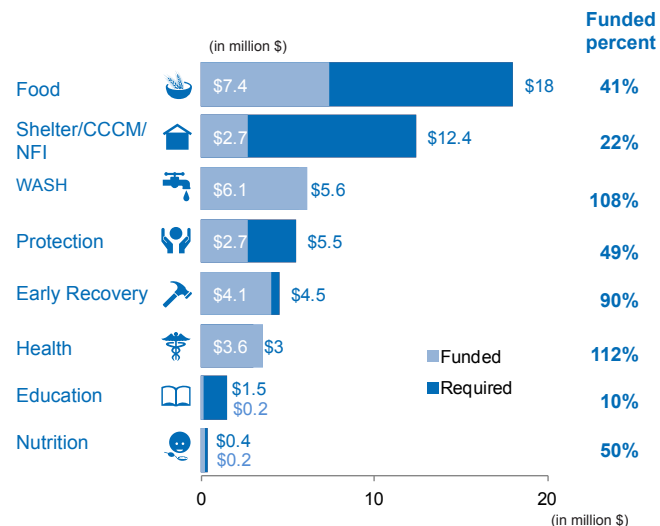
2013 CONTRIBUTIONS BY DONORS (ALL MYANMAR)

KACHIN RESPONSE PLAN 2013 (MARCH - DECEMBER 2013)



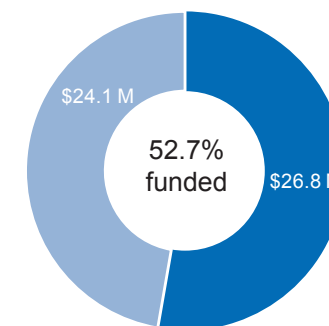

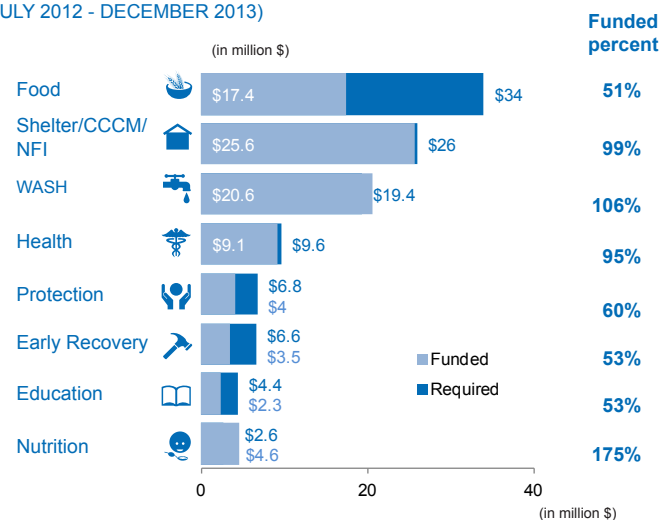

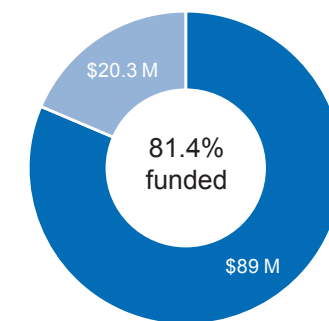


RAKHINE RESPONSE PLAN 2013 (JULY 2012 - DECEMBER 2013)

Kachin and Rakhine funding data shown in these charts represent only contributions specifically earmarked for Kachin and Rakhine. Donor resources contributed to national funding appeals of UNHCR and WFP are not included. These 'unearmarked' funds allow agencies to respond flexibly to priority humanitarian needs. Therefore, actual funding for Protection, Food, and Shelter/NFI/CCCM may be higher than shown in this table.

Contributions shown in this snapshot represents funding committed to sectors during the period of the response plans, not funding expended for project implementation. Because project cycles can span more than one calendar year, projects funded towards the end of 2013 will continue implementation during 2014. Sectors which appear to have received more funding than required have significant projects that will carry over into the first half of 2014.
