
Empower communities to detect and respond to child protection issues early

#### What did we accomplish in 2022?



2,652 children and youth assisted with

access to justice, including justice hotlines in ethnic languages



206,681 children and caregivers reached

with mental health and psychosocial support



child protection kits distributed in high-risk areas



27,428

children and adolescents received gender-based violence services

people, including 75,074 children, reached with mine and explosive ordinance risk education

#### What do we need?



Grave violations against children, including child recruitment, to be prevented by all parties to the conflict



Access to vulnerable children in armed conflict and disaster areas to provide life-saving child protection services



Community-based reintegration of child victims of grave violations, including children formerly associated with parties to the conflict



Continued expansion of integrated MHPSS services in basic service provision



\$26 million USD for child protection humanitarian programming



Sustainable investment in justice services for children in contact with the law and arbitrarily arrested/detained
