Improved WASH facilities in healthcare facilities and child learning spaces


What are we doing?

What did we accomplish in 2022?



600,000
people received critical water, sanitation and hygiene services



428,000 people provided access to safe water



communities provided solar-powered water systems



237,000
people reached with sanitation and hygiene services

What do we need?



Scale up of lifesaving humanitarian WASH services for IDPs and conflict-affected communities



Scale up of triple nexus WASH programming in conflict affected rural communities and peri-urban areas



Increased funding for innovative approaches to community capacity development, real time monitoring and climate resilient WASH services



Scale up in promotion of handwashing practices as defense against communicable diseases



US\$ 61.9 million for strategic WASH interventions in conflict-affected areas and vulnerable communities in peri-urban areas
