WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs rose sharply from 452,100 from last week to 459,800 this week.

In Kayah State, increased fighting, airstrikes, and shelling displaced 2,100 people from Moe Bye town and Hpasawng town. They sought safety in the respective townships.

In Shan State (South), 1,200 people from Moe Bye town in Pekon Township were displaced to Pekon town due to intensified fighting, airstrikes, and shelling on 10 June. In Kayin State, 260 people were displaced within Kyainseikgyi Township due to intensified fighting near their villages.

In Mon State, about 2,100 IDPs were verified following increased fighting during the first week of June 2023 - while 1,100 people were displaced within Ye Township, and 1,000 people displaced from Yebyu Township in Tanintharyi Region to Thanbyuzayat Township.

In Tanintharyi Region, about 2,500 people from six villages in Dawei, Thayetchaung, Yebyu, and Launglon Townships were displaced within the respective townships due to intensified fighting. Among them, 400 people were secondarily displaced in Dawei Township.
