WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs which has crossed the 400,000 mark, rose from 419,200 last week to 429,800 this week.


In Kayin State, 8,000 people were displaced to Kawkareik and Kyainseikgyi Townships due to intensified fighting, airstrikes and indiscriminate shelling in the Kyondoe area of Kawkareik Township. Among them, 6,000 people from Kyondoe town, Kawkareik Township were displaced within the township on 26 March 2023, while 2,000 people from at least seven villages in Kyainseikgyi Township were displaced to the jungle within the township on 20 March 2023. Some 430 IDPs from Myawaddy Township returned to their villages of origin following more stable security situation in the second week of February 2023.


In Tanintharyi Region, 3,000 people were displaced to Tanintharyi Township. OF this figure, 100 from Tanintharyi Township were displaced on 18 March 2023 due to troop movement and intensified fighting in the area while 2,900 people from Palaw Township were displaced to the jungle within the township.
