WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs has crossed the half a million mark, rising from 495,100 from last week to 501,900 this week.

In Bago Region (East), 3,300 people from Phyu Township were displaced within the township due to intensified fighting near their villages. In Kayin State's Myawaddy Township, increased fighting displaced 430 people to Myawaddy town. In Kayah State, 750 people from Loikaw township were displaced within the township due to fighting and shelling in their villages. 210 IDPs returned to their place of origin in Demoso Township.

In Shan State (South), 110 people from Loikaw Township, Kayah State were displaced to Hsihseng Township due to fighting and shelling around their villages.


In Tanintharyi Region, increased fighting and security concerns caused 3,200 people from five villages in Launglon Township to seek safety elsewhere within the township. 4,800 IDPs returned to their places of origin in Dawei Township and Thayetchaung Township between 7 and 10 July.


In Mon State, fighting and indiscriminate shelling displaced about 4,000 people from six villages in Billin Township within the township.

Across the border, 9,000 people from Myanmar remain displaced in Mae Hong Son Province, Thailand.
