IOM has been working in Migration, Trafficking, DRR, Emergency Response and Reconstruction, Camp Coordination and Camp Management. IOM trained CBDRR Training to 218 village tract/ward administrators in Rakhine. IOM supported government on development of Township Disaster Management in 4 townships, Emergency Response Contingency Plan for 4 townships and capacity building trainings. In addition, IOM will also collaborate with UDHRD in Rakhine area. IOM is currently supporting government on development of Myanmar Disaster Risk Assessment and Risk Mapping Guidance.
