Monitoring and Reporting Mechanism on Grave Violations Against Children in Situations of Armed Conflict Presentation	
The summary points of the presentation (presentation attached):	
The main objectives of the presentation 1. Orientate the objectives and purpose of the MRM, focusing on MRM related to EiE, in particular occupation of school 2. Familiarize with the six grave violations, reporting channel and reporting tool. 3. Collaborate in collecting incidents of six grave violations, particularly regarding EiE-related incidents	MRM will be a standing agenda point on the EiE sector meetings.
Case studies were provided to support the discussion on when to report as well as a summary of the simple reporting format. Discussion highlighted that under reporting happens across sectors, this be due to a lack of understanding of reporting mechanisms or for fear or reporting. Further discussion will take place between EiE Sector and UNICEF CP section on modalities for reporting. It was agreed that MRM will be included as a standing agenda point in EiE Sector meetings and that EiE Sector partners (subnational level) will also need to receive some orientation on reporting mechanism	sector partners as needed
