Now routine activities resume in Sittwe and Pauktaw camps.</li> <li>Already renovated breast feeding spaces in Sittwe were damaged but loss and damage list is still preparing.</li> <li>SCI supported School Health Programme (Nutrition) focusing on Vitamin A, deworming and Vitamin B1 topics and reached 400 students in 5 NFE schools and 1 middle schools in Thet Kel Pyin in the last week of July 2015.</li> <li>Due to funding constraints for the period October-December 2015, SCI plans to reduce Community Development Facilitators and volunteers effective 15 August 2015.SCI will also stop transport support to Rapid Response Team visiting Pauk Taw.</li> </ul>

UNICEF Field Office developed key messages for the cyclone and flood affected victims to air on FM radio and also take part in interagency initial rapid assessment in Minbya township.</li> <li>ACF</li> <li>There are 7 OTPs and 7 distribution points in Sittwe rural area. Thet Kel Pyin and Baw Du Pha OTPs, La Ma Shay and Mezaligone mobile OTPs were closed on 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> July 2015 due to cyclone but now resumed the activities.</li> <li>The roofs of the OTPs in Thet Kel Pyin, Baw Du Pha and Say Thamar Gyi OTPs were damaged. In Thet Kel Pyin and Baw Du Pha, the roof were temporarily renovated with tarpaulin to run the activities immediately and will fully repair soon.</li> </ul>
