### **ACF**

- ACF started implementing WHO Z-score for Weightfor-Height on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2015 in Sittwe.
- Hla Ma Shay OTP opened at IRC clinic on every Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- ACF STW has a plan to operate 2 more OTP mobiles in 2015 (one is around Say Tha Gyi and 1 around Basara) to increase the coverage of OTP.
- Cured rate get is 69 % which below SPHERE standards and non-responder rate is 29.8 % in April 2015
- SAM new admission is also decreasing in OTP linked partially to the water festival. This trend is similar to the previous year

### **WFP**

- Due to the funding and supply constraints, WFP provided Rice Soya Blend (RSB) for children aged 6-59 month and not to PLW in May 2015.
- There will be a gap for PLW probably for 2 months till shipment of WSB come probably in June 2015.

### MNMA

• MNMA implements their routine activities in 6 project townships as usual.

#### SRNT

 SRNT is collecting Vitamin A and deworming reports from Township Health Departments but Minbya and Rathedaung township reports were not yet received. Initial data revealed that Vitamin A coverage is more than 90% in most of the townships and 79 % in Buthidaung and 88 % in Maungdaw townships.

	<ul> <li>In April, SRNT team visited Mrauk U and Kyauk Taw up to RHC level for supervision and conducted Continuing. Medical Education and refresher training on MUAC screening, weighing of under 5 children and also conducted supply analysis.</li> <li>SRNT plans to visit Rathedaung and Minbya townships next month for supervision.</li> <li>WHO</li> <li>Myanmar Resource Foundation reopened their clinic today (5 May 2015) in Say Tha Mar Gyi camp.</li> <li>There was a specialist OPD started from 5 May 2015 in Sittwe and patients who required specialist opinion will be sent by ambulance to and from Dapaing to Sittwe hospital.5 patients were allowed in one ambulance together with 5 caretakers. The specialities includes medicine, surgery, obstetrics and gynaecology, paediatric, orthopaedics, eye, ear, throat and radiology.</li> </ul>
