Agency Updates on new activities, challenges, information sharing	 During Water festival, most of the staff are away from Sittwe and camp-based staff will perform routine activities; for instance screening, IYCF counselling, home visit and referral will continue in Sittwe and Pauktaw camps. MHAA MHAA Health and Nutrition activities have already been completed as of 21 March 2015. For the time being, emergency referral support remains functioning in 6 townships. There is no overlapping in emergency referral service between MHAA and ICRC due to different geographical coverage by the respective organization. UNICEF UNICEF is leading Nutrition Sector contingency planning for 2015 and needs inputs from the sector partners. 	Partners to provide their inputs into the contingency plan as requested.  UNICEF will articulate some key areas for consideration to be included in the nutrition sector strategic framework and work plan. Members have already contributed to the challenges in implementation which will be considered in the strategy/ work plan for the sector.

ACF

- ACF already distributed double ration to the beneficiaries for the water festival.
- Thet Kel Pyin OTP centre will open during the water festival and 1 standby staff is assigned there.
- Training for Traditional Birth Attendants and Traditional healers on MUAC measurement already accomplished.

WHO

- Deputy Minister for Health committed national level regular coordination meeting to be held in Nay Pyi Taw.
- Most of the clinics in Sittwe IDP camps will be closed from 13 to 18 April 2015 and referral service and MSF boat support remain functioning during the water festival.
- SHD Rapid Response Team will be deployed in Thet Kel Pyin RHC during the period.

WFP

 The Nutritionist from Yangon went to the IDP camps and found out that Blended food are not properly used. WFP discussed with implementing partners in an effort to make them understand and emphasise the need for awareness creation to beneficiaries not to sell the rations.

- IYCF working group to keep members posted on the progress with the plans for the training.
- Compile areas for consideration and share with national sector coordinator for further discussions at the national level.

 Partners to create awareness about nutrition products, including blended fortified food how and what they should be used for. Within the next one month

	 WFP conducted training to implementing partners to understand and emphasize on the nutritional values of food. There will be a follow up meeting in next month. Government is going to conduct the household survey to determine proper IDPs and thereby correct numbers of IDPs will be available and this will minimize commodity wastage. MNMA MNMA will temporarily suspend their activities during the water festival and resume later. SRNT SRNT is collecting VAS and deworming report from the township health departments. Five townships do not send the reports yet. Nutrition partners need to share the VAS reports with SHD and SRNT.SRNT has received report from MHAA only. Target for VAS is very low in some Sittwe IDP camps and incredible percentage coverage attained. A single organization should not miss 3 consecutive meetings. Absence with apology is appreciated and members can send updates for sharing with other sector members. If less than 5 organizations are present, the nutrition sector meeting will not convene on that very day. Extension of contractual agreements between organizations should be prepared way in advance of expiry to avoid unnecessary gaps in service provision and for sustainability.
