Topic 2: Upda	te from WASH Cluster
Summary of	HNO/HRO 2017
discussion	Cluster Coordinator briefed partners on the process of HNO/HRP for next year. Below are the key discussion points.
	<ul> <li>HNO (Humanitarian Needs Overview) is almost finalized which identifies overall humanitarian needs in Myanmar including IDPs, Non displaced stateless peo- ple, returnees/relocated and other vulnerable population.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>HNO figures were mainly agreed upon at National level by ICCG/HCT in consul- tation with Govt and concerned clusters. There might be slight changes in some of the figures in coming days as discussions are still going on with Govt.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Subsequently HRP (Humanitarian Response Plan), is in process and consultation at State and Union level is on-going with Govt. WASH Cluster partners are ad- vised to consider key points like provision of hygiene kits/per year and its re- plenishment periodically with key items like soaps and sanitary pads etc. Like- wise desludging and other sanitation services improvement. Water quality</li> </ul>

	monitoring also needs to be integral part of the activities and accordingly budgeting should be considered for this.
	<ul> <li>Partners should look into their budgeting realistically as well to better cover the identified gaps. Budgeting should cover both camps and non-camps locations as well as programmatic and support cost needs to be split. Partners should have per person/year value for budgeting.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Preparedness cost also needs to be included in the budget.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>WASH cluster discussed last year HRP objective and indicators, and suggestions sought for inclusion of key points like protection mainstreaming in WASH, WASH in Schools (WinS), accountability/transparency etc in the new HRP.</li> </ul>
	• After WASH cluster meeting, WASH cluster will share that template and part- ners need to review and update their targeted population.

	<ul> <li>Timeline - State level consultation with gov't and partners – week of Nov 6, State cluster to national by Nov 10, National Cluster to submit to OCHA by Nov 14, Final HRP 2018 by Nov 30.</li> </ul>
	Cluster Updates:
	• WASH Cluster partners have started distribution of hygiene kits in different lo- cations of Pauktaw township camps and in Sittwe camps. So far distribution have taken place in ANY, Sin Tet Maw and NC 2. Hygiene kits have also been distributed in some of the camps in Sittwe by Oxfam. There are some issues of population verification in NC 1 and UNICEF is in coordination with Camp man- agement agency (LWF) to resolve the issues.
	• Protection mainstreaming in WASH was discussed and partners requested for further orientation/training of field based staff.
	<ul> <li>WASH Cluster is working in collaboration with UNOCHA Information Management Unit for mapping out activities disruption in different areas. First round of information collected analysis is going on and will be shared accordingly with partners once done.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>WASH Cluster compiled data for quarter 3 and newsletter will be shared with partners in coming days once finalized.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Oxfam- Total 5574 hygiene kits distributed for STMG camp and Sat Yoe Kya 2, Set Yone Su 1 and Min Gan which are relocated in Sittwe Township. And Oxfam is planning to conduct one day workshop on Tiger worm and will share details of with WASH cluster. This workshop will take place in Sittwe on 21<sup>st</sup> Nov, 2017.</li> </ul>
	• SI- SI will distribute Hygiene kits for month of September and October in Sittwe Camps area and also planning to distribute spare parts of CWF in November
	<ul> <li>PLAN- Reopening field office again in Mruak U Township in October. Project ar- ea is Minbya Township and have no HK distribution planning but conducting hy- giene promotion session only in the villages.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>RI- During this week, staff members are visiting the camp in Mayebon Township and planning hygiene kits distribution next week. RI is regularly conducting hy- giene promotion sessions in Schools and communities.</li> </ul>
