	previous WASH cluster meeting were updated, including progress, and challenges.

	day, 13 August 2017.

Topic 2: Camp	Situation/security by Agencies			
Summary of discussion	<ul> <li>Oxfam mentioned that 52 boreholes with hand pump for communities had been provided by government in the Say Tha Ma Gyi camp but those 52 BH are not working well at the present because muddy water is coming out when pumping. It is very difficult to have frequent desludging due to road condition in raining season.</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>DRC mentioned and shared information to the WASH cluster about the 5 shelters constructed by IRM in Ohn Taw Gyi South. One incinerator is very close to the shelters and communities are worrying about the acrid smell of smoke filled their room, during the burning the waste.</li> </ul>			
	RI said that the previous time, not allowed every day to go to the Taung Paw cam in Maypon Township, allowed only Mon, Tue and Friday and now TA allowed for every day. 70% of latrines had been completed repaired and starting			

site cleaning/land preparing for the incinerator construction.

- SCI planned to distribute hygiene kits on next week, but it is depends on current security situation.
- 7 blocks (14) latrines finished by CDN in Khaung Doke Khar camp and planned HK distribution in the 3 camps, which are Khaung Doke Khar, Ohn Taw Cahy and Set Yoe Kyat 1. Desludging activity planned in this month for Khaung Doke Khar, Ohn Taw Cahy.
- Cristian Aid is planning to implement WASH project Mingan, recollected camp in Sittwe and Ah Aauk Yee host and Kyien Ni Pyin host villages in Pauk Taw Townships and LWF is implementing partner of Cristian Aid. LWF requested suggestion and feedback form Oxfam and SI to avoid duplicate in the next future.
- IRM is providing 50 shelters in Ohn Taw Gyi South with MHDO and not implementing WASH activities but 19 BH/HP will be provided with these shelters.
- IFRC is working with MRCS, training in Hygiene Promotion, WASH and hygiene kits distribution in Sittwe. Constructing latrine and hand pump figures will be shared later on as per geographically.
- SI resumed the activities in Nget Chaung 1 on August 7<sup>th</sup> 2017.

#### **Topic 3: Update on Coordination Meeting in Nget Chaung 1**

# Summary of discussion

• SI shared with CMA (LWF), WASH Cluster (UNICEF) and local Authorities (PKT TA) that the Village Administrators of Nget Chaung 1 and one landowner were blocking the WASH activities. WASH standards were not guarantee and safe water was not distributed (possible public health issue). SI is not able to solve the problem since it is related to rental fees benefits. On 3<sup>rd</sup> August a meeting was organize by LWF and UNICEF in order to ask for a solution to the Village Administrators and PKT TA. No real solution was provided by PKT TA. At the end of the meeting the Village Administrators requested SI to resume the activities. The activities were resumed on August 7<sup>th</sup> but since no solution was given regarding landowner issue, new problems are expected to be raises in the next future, like it's happening since January 2017. This situation is currently becoming unsustainable since SI staff is threatened on a daily basis and the continue stopping and resuming the activities is wasting resources and decreasing drastically the quality of SI WASH response.
