- ▶ Rakhine: KyawTaw, Sittwe, Pauktaw, Phoneygun

▶ **Types of sites in Rakhine state:**

- ▶ Existing protracted camps,
- ▶ Villages included in HRP but not covered

The activities include

▶ **Activities:**

- ▶ Emergency water supply, water quality testing and treatment, operation and maintenance of water points and latrines,
- ▶ Emergency sanitation including desludging and solid waste management.
- ▶ Sanitation provision for persons with disabilities, for women at night, people with special needs and child-friendly latrines.
- ▶ Complementary items to meet the minimum hygiene kit composition in Rakhine.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Hygiene promotion, post distribution monitoring and rapid assessments are other activities. ▶ WASH in temporary learning spaces including infrastructure and supply of hygiene items. ▶ Minor drainage works where CCCM/Shelter is unable to cover. <p>CDC Ceramic Water Filter Study Findings:</p> <p>In 2017 August-Nov CDC Atlanta conducted a study for reviewing efficacy of Ceramic Water Filters. Finding of the study were presented in the meeting and cluster is proposing to review water strategies as per recommendations of CDC study.</p> <p>4Ws and Funding Matrix:</p> <p>4Ws for quarter is in the process of analysis along with funding situation. So far the Rakhine WASH Cluster have got around 6 million USD (30 %) of total 21 M requirement. WASH Cluster stressed the matter of timely sharing partner's information as to capture more realistic situation in terms of reach and funding, requested partners accordingly to share their information on due time. Topic 3: Cluster Partners Updates

Summary of discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SCI- Pauk Taw, Sin Tet Maw camp, 10 solar lights were stolen , Camp leader took the concrete posts from the pond which was not used and located nearby SCI WASH office and SCI provided fencing to protect children. • DRC- Latrine construction was also delayed because of CMC issue. 36 blocks of Latrines in Kyein Ni Pyin Camp are under process. In Ohn Taw Gyi, 16 blocks of latrines and 26 disable latrines are constructed. • CDN shared they have planned to provide gender segregated toilets including sanitary dust bin, solid waste disposal for sanitary accessories in 2 camps from Sittwe. (Detailed lesson related with MHM can be discussed in TWG). • MA-UK have got secured funding for Nidin camp till March, 2019. They will provide complete WASH services in newly relocated site.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MA-UK distributed H/kits amongst people living in Nidin camp. • MHDO- 15 villages in Pauk Taw have been providing water and sanitation supports with GIZ funding, 3 New Ponds construction and 9 Pond renovation installed with solar pipe water system are ongoing. Among 1,950 latrines construction activity with concrete rings, 700 Latrines have done. Through UNICEF funding in northern part of Rakhine, there are implementing in 7 villages from Rathedaung, 16 villages from Buthidaung and 18 villages in Maungdaw. 6 toilets for Buthidaung Hospital and 3 toilets for Rathedaung Hospital are under construction. About 5,000 UNICEF Hygiene Kits will be delivered to Buthidaung and Maungdaw both communities in the targeted area. Through the Mobile clinic, Health and Nutrition activities are integrated with the targeted villages. Some of them are replaced as the new coverage villages from empty villages. OFDA funding WASH, Nutrition and Livelihood project will be starting soon. Currently approved TA from CC have been received for May 2018 and need to apply on monthly basis. • UNICEF completed hygiene kits distribution in Maungdaw on April 2018, in total over 10,260 hygiene kits were distributed that benefited for over 63,238 people, including 23,283 children • UNICEF and partners providing regular operation and maintenance, as well as rehabilitation of latrines in 5 IDP camps in Sittwe, Myebon, Kyauk Phyu, and Pauktaw Township, benefited for over 33,324 individuals. • Oxfam- SI still faces issues of blockages of services in OTG and TKP camps. • Oxfam Tiger worm project extended till Oct, 2018. A workshop is planned in Oct to share the findings of project.
