Summary of Discussion	<p><i>Please refer to the Presentation for details.</i></p> <p>The WASH Cluster section of the HRP has finally been submitted (following SAG revision).</p> <p>Main highlights presented:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Overall PIN (provided by OCHA): 985,658 people</li> <li>- WASH Overall PIN: 869,154 people</li> <li>- WASH Target: 527,991 people</li> <li>- Total cost: 33,2M</li> </ul> <p>This does not present great variations from 2019.</p> <p>Main bulk of targeted population identified (as expected) in Rakhine.</p> <p>Population in Rakhine includes new displacement occurred in mid 2019</p> <p>New states included in HRP: Chin and Kayin</p> <p>Other vulnerable groups: estimated 20% of the population.</p>	30mins	Cristina
