
- **Crises** Armed conflict, environmental disasters, COVID-19, market events, etc.





### **Price Changes by Product**

#### **Product-Level Price Changes**

**Essential Foods – Rice prices increased for a second straight month in May, climbing 10% or more in most markets.** Most markets saw prices increase at least 10% for cheaper rice and at least 20% for better rice (on top of earlier increases in April).Prices for palm oil and pulses were generally stable in May, although they too rose in Sittwe, Minbya and Ponnagyun.

### **Vegetables** – Vegetables logged a third month of sharp price increases in May, and many common items were unavailable.

Most markets monitored saw prices for onion, eggplant, long bean, watercress and green chili increase by at least 30% in May, and often price increases were much higher. Vegetable stockouts were common—particularly in Minbya, Mrauk-U, Paletwa, and Pauktaw—likely due to crop damage from Cyclone Mocha.








### **Price Changes by Product**

Hygiene Products – Prices for hygiene products returned to pre-cyclone levels in May, although prices rose in Kyauktaw. Prices for most hygiene products increased 10-20% or more in the weeks following Cyclone Mocha, but by late-May prices had returned to pre-cyclone levels. The exception was Kyauktaw, which saw another month of rising prices for hygiene products.


Meat and Fish – Prices increased in May for processed goods like dried fish and fish paste, but other meat/fish were stable. Most markets saw prices for dried fish and fish paste—stored items prone to damage in Cyclone Mocha—increase by 7% and 4%, respectively. Prices for other meat/fish items like shrimp, fresh fish, and chicken rose or fell by 10% but mostly held stable.


**Other NFIs – NFI prices began returning to pre-cyclone levels in May, but many goods remained out of stock.** Prices for plastic tarps were 15-30% higher than April (down from 200-400% spikes following Cyclone Mocha). Blankets and mosquito nets—

### **Market Price Report**

The MAU tracks market prices in Central and Northern Rakhine State and Chin State. Data are collected from three vendors per product per market in the last week of each month. Data and product specifications are available online through the MPR dashboard at **www.themimu.info/market-analysis-unit**.

#### **KEY FINDINGS**

- Rice prices were up 10-20% in most markets in May, doubling the size of April's price increases;
- Vegetable prices spiked sharply in May, and vegetable supply was poor in most markets monitored;
- **Prices rose for processed fish products** like dried fish and fish paste, but other meat/fish items were stable;
- **Prices for pulses and palm oil were fairly stable**, although they rose in Sittwe and Ponnagyun;

- Prices for NFIs began returning to pre-cyclone levels, but stockouts remained a problem especially in Sittwe;
- **Tarp prices remained 15-30% higher than April**, down from far-larger price increases after Cyclone Mocha;

#### What to Watch

- Greater attention to **food security** and **nutrition** will be needed due to spiking rice prices and poor supply of vegetables;
- Access to shelter and NFIs remain a major concern, particularly in Sittwe where prices remain high and goods remain unavailable;



#### MAU Basket Composition


The MAU Basket consists of prices for 29 products, classified into five categories: Essential Food, Vegetables, Hygiene, Meat / Fish, and Other NFIs. The unit of measurement for each product (e.g. 1kg, 1 unit) was selected for convenience, therefore some categories make up a far larger portion of the total basket. Importantly, the basket is not intended to represent total household consumption or minimum household expenditure. However, because the basket composition is stable over time, it may serve as a (imperfect) benchmark for comparing price changes for different townships or categories of goods. ### Methodology

#### Design

- Market selection (type, location)
- Product selection
- Specifications / rules

### Collection

- Timing, frequency
- Sampling (vendors-per-product)
- Modality (phone / in-person)

### **Organizing and Cleaning**

- Tools (e.g., Kobo)
- Data processing (e.g., Python)
- QC checks

#### Analysis

• Mean/median, non/rolling-averages, period-of-change, indexing ("basket"), inflation, etc.

#### Presentation

- Chart design
- Reports, dashboard, tables (.csv)
