

Recommendations:

- 1) Introduce yourself before starting the interview (your role and your organization)
- 2) Present the general objective of the survey which is to assess the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the overall Child Protection situation through the following themes¹:
 - Knowledge of prevention practices and other information on COVID-19
 - Child protection risks: family separation; violence, abuse, exploitation of children and other harmful practices; psychological distress
 - Availability of Child Protection Services
 - Education
 - Communication networks
- 3) Key informants * must have a good knowledge of their localities and the communities that live there
- 4) Make NO promises or create expectations: make it clear to your contact that these responses will be used for investigative purposes only and are not directly related to a decision regarding the provision of assistance or services
- 5) Vary the gender and type of your key informants
- 6) Be sure to obtain informed consent from Key Informants.
