






February 2025 prices by Area





- Rice: Stocks from the harvest are still available and according to traders, demand remains stable in both domestic and international markets. The reference rate has also decreased slightly.
- Palm oil: Although the reference price decreased slightly during the reporting month, consumers continued to purchase at prices higher than the reference rate due to quotas.
- **Chickpeas:** The arrival of newly harvested pulses in the local market has led to a decrease in the price of chickpeas.
- Tomatoes & Onions were more widely available throughout the country during the reporting month. The supply of new onions into the market has contributed to a decline in prices.
- Kayah: The mobile network and internet have shut down in Demoso township. When placing an order, commodities take at least about two weeks to arrive.
- Chin: Commodity flow is disrupted due to the continued closure of the Hakha-Kalay road. With rice imports to Hakha township restricted, locals are seeking and purchasing from other available sources.
- Tanintharyi: Transportation challenges, commodity restrictions, high transport costs, and insecurity continue to persist in the region.
- Rakhine: Connectivity issues remain a major challenge in Rakhine. However, commodities are available in most townships thanks to cargo ships arriving from Yangon.
- Fuel: In the reporting month, fuel shortages, limited fuel sale hours, and high prices were observed in Tachileik township in eastern Shan state and Myawaddy township in Kayin state, due to supply cuts from Thailand.

Data was collected from 62 townships, 88 markets, and 267 shops during the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> weeks of February 2025.
