#### (5) Challenges and Baisc Need Items

##### (5.1) Challenges

- Operational Challenges: Limited road access slowing down response efforts.
- Staffing Issues: Need for additional logistics and finance personnel.
- Because of heavy rain and windy untimely, affected peoples, deployed RCVs and field staff were without safe areas
- Limitation of WASH related items available in Mandalay market

##### (5.2) Mostly Requested from the Branches

- ORS, Water Purified, Food
- Tarpaulins, Mosquito Nets, Hygiene Materials, Shelter, RCVs Safety Mantrials
- Health Care Services, First Aid Kits, MHPSS
- Solor panel for light and communication
- Death Body Bags

### (5.3) Urgent Needs

- More shelter materials to meet growing demand
- Water distribution and WASH activities especially emergency latrines
- Enhanced Camp Managements
- Generator for WASH Teams

### RNA Teams Recommendations

- Cash assistance should be provided to the affected people to meet the basic needs.
- WASH intervention activities should be implemented particularly for the domestic and drinking water
- The excavator should be provided to clear the debris of the damaged buildings as some households can't afford to do it themselves.
- The condition of the underground water should be tested as the color of domestic water were changed.
