Shelter: (30) tarpaulin sheets were provided in the Thi Win Taing camp in the Oak Tha Ra Thi Ri ward in Oak Tha Ra Thi Ri township to make additional temporary shelters, covering the urgent needs of all the relocated households. Additionally, (90) tarpaulin sheets were also provided to the Department of Human Resources for Health from Ministry of Health covering additional affected households.

- Because of heavy rain and windy untimely, affected peoples, deployed RCVs and field staff were without safe areas
- Limitation of WASH related items available in Mandalay market
