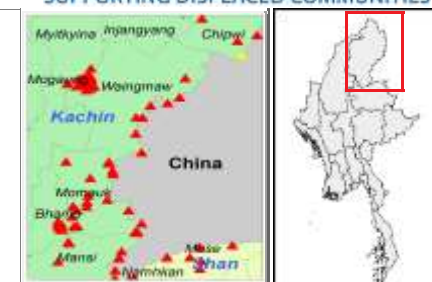

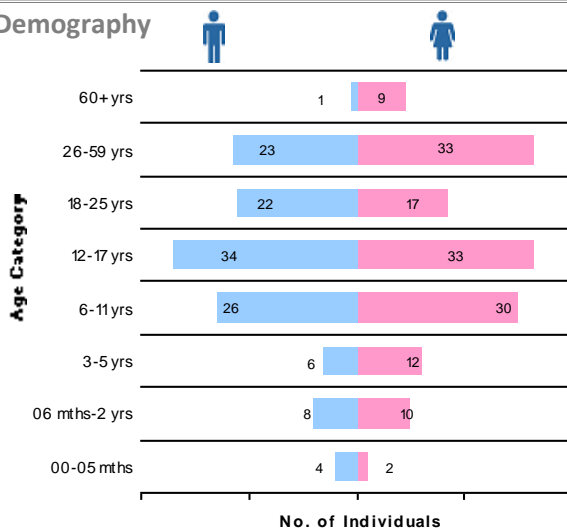

Sources of information include CCCM focal points, camp managers, camp committee members/leaders and IDP camp residents. This camp profiling exercise aims to provide updated information about the services available to the camp population.
