

## Cluster objectives and activities:

CO1: Evolving protection concerns, needs, and violations are monitored, analyzed, and responded to through multilayered protection response, upholding fundamental rights and restoring the dignity, physical safety and well-being of affected populations. (Monitoring and Response)

CA1: Explosive ordnance victims/survivors and their families have access to necessary health care, rehabilitation, reintegration, and socio-economic support.

CO2: A conducive environment to prevent and mitigate protection risks and concerns is supported through inclusive, localized community protection approaches, mainstreaming of protection and enhancement of capacity of protection and non-protection actors to address the impacts of armed conflict and other shocks on civilians. (Risk mitigation and prevention)

CA2: Increase awareness and education on the risks of explosive ordnance among at-risk populations.

CO3: Cluster coordination and information management are strengthened at all levels.

CA3 Dedicated cluster coordination and information management by six staff members: 1 national coordinator, 1 national IMO, 4 subnational co-coordinators.

CA4: Advocacy to reduce and ultimately stop the indiscriminate use of landmines and victim-activated IEDs and limit their impact on the civilian population.
