

## Cluster objectives and activities:

CO1: Suffering, morbidity, and mortality is prevented or reduced among 600,000 displaced, returned, stateless and other crisis-affected people experiencing or at risk of food insecurity, malnutrition, and health threats.

CA1: Screen children 6-59 months for wasting.

CA2: Screen PLW for malnutrition.

CA3: Admit children aged 6-59 months with SAM for treatment.

CA4: Admit children aged 6-59 months with MAM for treatment.

CA5: Admit PLW with MAM for treatment.

CA6: Provide boys and girls aged 6-59 months at risk of acute malnutrition in priority locations blanket supplementary feeding support.

CA7: Provide PLWs at risk of acute malnutrition in priority locations blanket supplementary feeding.

CA8: Provide primary caregivers of children 0-23 months IYCF counselling.

CA9: Provide children 6-59 months multiple micronutrient powders.

CA10: Provide pregnant women preventative multiple micro-nutrient tablet or iron-folic acid supplementation.

CA11: Provide children 6-59 months cash and voucher assistance.

CA12: Provide PLWs cash and voucher assistance.

CA13: Provide children aged 6-59 months vitamin A supplementation.

CO2: Cluster coordination and information management are strengthened at all levels.

CA14: Dedicated cluster coordination and information management by eight staff members: 1 national coordinator, 1 national deputy coordinator, 1 national IMO, and 5 subnational coordinators.
