Myanmar Delivery Summary (Q3-2024)




EMERGENCY/MYANMAR

(1 Jan 2024 - 30 Sep 2024)



Widespread conflict continued to drive displacement and exacerbate needs across multiple states and regions in Myanmar. Intensified airstrikes, artillery shelling, drone attacks as well as the use of antipersonnel landmines and cluster bombs are impacting forcibly displaced people and host communities. According to the UN, the number of displaced people inside Myanmar exceeded 3.4 million as of September 2024. Humanitarian access constraints continued to expose people to various protection risks and restrict the delivery of critical assistance and protection. Coping capacities have been stretched to the limit, with food, emergency shelter and core relief items (CRIs) identified as the most urgent needs. Additionally, some 633,975 Rohingya persons remain stateless, of which some 247,783 are living in displacement camps as well as among the host community since 2012 within Rakhine State and face greater hardship due to systematic discrimination, regular violation of their rights and socio-economic difficulties. UNHCR and partners are adapting and responding to the volatile situation and the urgent needs on the ground.



¹ Persons benefitting from direct support. The total persons supported may include multiple counting of beneficiaries receiving assistance through more than one activity during the reporting period. This does not include 309,561 persons residing in UNHCR managed camps/sites, unless they have recieved other types of assistance.² For QIP projects, people benefiting are only counted when the projects are completed.³ Targets are updated periodically.
