WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs decreased from 1,050,300 last week to 1,033,300 this week.


In Shan State (South), 276 IDPs returned from Nyaungshwe to Loikaw Township (in Kayah State), and 2,090 IDPs returned from Taunggyi Township to Lashio and Kyauk Me Townships, in Shan State (North).


In Kayin State, 4,537 IDPs returned to their places of origin within Hpa-An Township due a decrease in the sensation of insecurity. Another 890 IDPs returned from Kawt Yin Kyaung to Kamarmaung Town. On the other hand, in Thaundaunggyi Township, 734 IDPs from Tha Pyay Nyunt were displaced a second time to Taungoo Town due to armed clashes. In Mon State, 105 people from Waw Township, in Bago Region (East), were newly displaced to Kyaikto Township.

In Bago Region (East), 698 IDPs from Htantabin Township were displaced again to Taungoo Town also as a result of clashes.


In Tanintharyi Region, 8,818 IDPs returned to their places of origin in Yebyu and Tanintharyi Townships on 28 March 2025. Nevertheless, 369 people from Nyaung Pin Kwin and 1,885 IDPs from Thein Khun, Tanintharyi Township were newly and secondarily displaced due to ongoing clashes and airstrikes.

Finally, 551 people from Hsihseng Township, in Shan State (South) were newly displaced to Loikaw Township, in Kayah State, due to shelling and movement of armed groups.
