WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 1.048,500 last week to 1.050.900 this week.


In Shan South, 590 people from Thit Kyeik, Pekon Township, were displaced within the same township due to concerns about airstrikes and their safety. Additionally, 832 people from Yae Pu, Nyaungshwe Township, were displaced to the San Khar area, Nyaungshwe Township, due to shelling and airstrikes by the Myanmar Armed Forces (MAF). IDP returns were also recorded: 1,595 people from Nyaungshwe and Pekon, Shan South, relocated to Loikaw Town, while eight individuals from Shwenyaung returned due to water scarcity and property maintenance. Additionally, 485 IDPs from Mongnai Township moved back to Lashio after their children completed school.

In Kayah State, 202 IDPs from Inn Gyin Kone, Nyaungshwe, returned to Kayah but stayed in collective centers in Loikaw Town. Additionally, 545 IDPs from Par Laung, Loikaw Township, returned to their place of origin, Loikaw Town.


In Bago East, 1,928 people from Ta Laing Aing, Htantabin Township, were newly displaced within the same township due to intensified clashes, including indiscriminate shelling and airstrikes by MAF. Additionally, 158 IDPs from Ta Laing Aing, Htantabin Township, were secondarily displaced to Myo Gyi Ward, Taungoo Town.

In Kayin State, 3,130 people from Kyauk Gyi Taung, Tha Pyay Nyunt, Thandaunggyi Township, were displaced within the same township due to indiscriminate shelling by MAF.
