WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 503,200 last week to 513,000 this week.

In Bago Region (East), increased fighting displaced about 6,500 people. Among them were 1,600 people in Taungoo Township and 4,900 in Htatabin Township.

In Mon State, intensified fighting displaced 4,200 people - 1,800 in Billin Township, 1,300 in Kyaikto Township and 1,100 in Thaton Township. 2,400 IDPs in Mon State were secondarily displaced.

In Tanintharyi Region, intensified fighting displaced 3,700 people - 1,200 in Yebyu Township and 2,500 in Launglong Township. Among them were 390 IDPs displaced secondarily in Yebyu Township. However, 1,700 IDPs returned to their place of origin in Dawei Township.


In Shan State (South), 690 IDPs who have been displaced to Pinlaung Township returned to their place of origin in Loikaw Township, Kayah State.

Across the border, about 9,100 people from Myanmar remain displaced in Mae Hong Son Province, Thailand.






BY STATE/REGION (26 Jun - 21 Aug)


