1. International Development and Early Learning Assessment (IDELA) Tool (*World Vision*)

The [IDELA Tool](#) comes from Save the Children and is being used by World Vision International in partnership with them. It is designed for low-income countries and involves interviewing individual children ages 3.5 to 6.5. Currently used in over 40 countries, it covers 24 themes and 4 domains.

IDELA measures two key indicators: how well children are developing and how ready they are for school.

There was a discussion on requirements to work as an Enumerator for the IDELA system. Basically, anyone can qualify as long as they complete the IDELA Enumerator Training. This could include program staff, preschool teachers, or anyone who works closely with children.

The main resources for using IDELA are the Kobo Collect APK, a Scoring Sheet Administration Guide, and Stimulus Cards.

The tool focuses on Motor Development (physical skills), Emergent Literacy (reading and writing basics), Emergent Numeracy (early math skills), Social-Emotional Development (social and emotional skills), and Executive Function (memory and self-control). This data helps to understand a child's growth, behavior, and the kind of support they might need.

The discussion wrapped up with an overview of the dashboard based on data collected by the IDELA system.

2. MIMU HDP Nexus 5W (*MIMU*)

MIMU's HDP Nexus 5W has been operational since 2007, based on voluntary data provided by both local and international organisations. The 5W data (Who, What, Where, When, Whom) supports project management, identifying needs, and planning and implementing projects.

The latest 5W covers project data from 217 organisations.

- Who (Which organisation) – Only Project Owners and Project Implementers are included; Donors are not tracked.
- What (Which projects) – Project titles are collected under 22 sectors and 152 sub-sectors.
- Where (Project Location) – From the State/Region level down to Villages/Camps.
- When (Time frame) – Project status is categorised as Planned, Ongoing, Suspended, or Completed/Ended, with start and end dates.
- Whom (Target groups) – Projects for IDPs, vulnerable groups, and development-oriented activities.

MIMU's 5W products include Dashboards, Maps, Charts, and 5W Trends Report. Organizations that have contributed their 5W data to MIMU can request full datasets through their official email or an online form.

3. Updates on Sector/Cluster/Agency Initiatives

CPI: Recently carried out a Rapid Assessment with Health Cluster. There is ongoing work to gather and analyze information on how the floods have affected project areas and identify who needs what kind of support. As the year end approaches, proposals are now being submitted.

MIMU: The IM Workshop is currently ongoing. GIS Training is set for December, and Communications and Data Visualization Training just finished in November. Advanced Excel Training is scheduled for January or February 2025: participants who have completed the Basic Excel and/or IM Workshop can join after passing a pre-test.

All 5W products from the latest round are now available, and an Assessment/Publication tracking exercise related to Disability Inclusion is planned for January or February 2025.

MIMU is supporting UNFPA for Indicator No. 9 (Data) under the UNCT scorecard's Disability Inclusion Strategy, which tracks how well organizations are implementing Disability Inclusion. From 2014 to 2024, 16 organizations produced 66 Disability Inclusion reports, and a Dashboard was created to compile them. A webpage to present these is also in the works. Because some data is restricted, a Restricted Dashboard is also planned. Participants were encouraged to participate in this initiative if they have any reports related to Disability Inclusion.
