Main highlights presented: Overall PIN (provided by OCHA): 985,658 people WASH Overall PIN: 869,154 people WASH Target: 527,991 people Total cost: 33,2M This does not present great variations from 2019. Main bulk of targeted population identified (as expected) in Rakhine. Population in Rakhine includes new displacement occurred in mid 2019 New states included in HRP: Chin and Kayin Other vulnerable groups: estimated 20% of the population.	30mins	Cristina

	Objectives		
	Sector Objective 1: 527,991 crisis affected people have equitable, inclusive and safe access to safe/improved drinking water meeting demand for domestic purposes, at minimum/agreed standards		
	Sector Objective 2: 527,991 crisis affected people have equitable, inclusive and safe access to functional excreta disposal systems		
	Sector Objective 3: 527,991 crisis affected people have equitable, inclusive and safe access to hygiene items and community -tailored messages, enabling health seeking behavior		
	Sector Objective 4: 68,807crisis affected people have access to integrated/mainstreamed WASH services, on the basis of risk-sensitive programming and consultation with communities		
	Sector Objective 5: 38,605 crisis affected people in temporary health facilities and temporary learning spaces have access to integrated/mainstreamed WASH services		
	These Objectives have been identified after broad consultation with multiple Clusters/Sectors and WASH SAG. This HRP will not only address WASH coverage alone, but also will target other identified vulnerabilities. Increased coordination efforts will be put to bridge the gap with operations: at state level, WASH Cluster will take the lead and organize common points with the concerned clusters/sectors: Health, Protection and Education.
