

#### **Situation Overview**

In the early hours of 25 August, violence broke out in Rakhine State. The extent and implications remain uncertain. To date, unverified estimations based on consolidated field reports of the agencies working in Cox's Bazar are that 409,000<sup>1</sup> people are estimated to have crossed the border into Bangladesh.


### **Key Observations**

- Biometric registration by the Department of Immigration and Passports and local administration is ongoing, with crowds of arrivals waiting in line to be registered.
- Border guards, local residents and camp committees in the pre-existing makeshift settlements are continuing to direct new arrivals to the new spontaneous settlements. Significant numbers of new arrivals observed along the roadsides at Kutupalong and thousands of new arrivals are reportedly taking shelter in the Teknaf urban area.
- The number of new arrivals observed in host communities is decreasing, and have been observed moving to other sites. Nevertheless significant numbers of new arrivals remain in local communities and have formed urban and rural slums.
- Six people from the local community who were self-identified camp managers at Moiner Gona and were charging people for land and shelter, have been arrested and imprisoned for 15 days.
- Rising prices of household items, rent, public transportation fares and labour observed in Teknaf and Ukiah towns.
- Cox's Bazar Sadar hospital opened up a separate ward and surgery unit for the new arrivals. There are high number of gunshot wound injuries and diarrhea cases.
- The Prime Minister's Office hosted a meeting in which it was clarified that the National Taskforce would remain in place, with MoDMR/RRRC playing a strong operational role and leading in Shelter and Site Management. The Secretary of MoDMR will travel to Cox's Bazar on 16 September to discuss the plan for site development of 2,000 acres with humanitarian partners.

## Methodology for Population Tracking

Fluid movement makes the tracking of new arrivals challenging. Figures are triangulated estimates based on the visual observation of key informants: the new arrivals have not been verified at household level. In particular, the number of affected population in host communities remains unclear. Daily data for arrivals in host communities is not available.
