MoHS Statement on COVID-19 (5 March 2020, 8:00PM) (Link) (Unofficial translation by OCHA)

- 1. The Ministry of Health and Sports (MoHS) has been working on monitoring and preventive measures of the COVID-19, which has been spreading in China and 77 countries in the world, at international entrances/gates, at public hospitals and among communities, as well as in cooperation with private hospitals.
- 2. In doing so, a 27-year-old woman of Myanmar citizen, who lives in Bhamo Township in Kachin State, returned from Ruili Town of China on 4 March 2020 and found with high body temperature at the Muse border gate of northern Shan State. As the woman has been suffering from fever and coughing since 2 March 2020, she has been sent to Muse General Hospital. She has been under treatment in an isolation room as a Person Under Investigation (PUI), and nasal swab taken from her will be sent and teste at the National Health Laboratory (NHL) in Yangon. Currently, no acute respiratory symptoms were found.
- 3. In the evening of 5 March 2020, the NHL has released results of the following patients, stating they tested negative for COVID-19.
- (a) A 32-year-old man in Weibargi Hospital [Yangon Region]
- (b) A 9-year-old boy in Muse Muse General Hospital [Northern Shan State].
- 4. As of 6:00 PM on 5 March 2020, three patients have been treated under surveillance at designated hospitals.
- 5. The 26-year-old man under surveillance in Kyaukpadaung Township Hospital was in good health as of the evening on 5 March 2020.
- 6. The MoHS has been speeding up monitoring although there were no laboratory-confirmed cases as of 5 March 2020. The MoHS calls on people to exactly follow the MoHS health guidelines as the COVID-19 has been spreading in China and other 77 countries in the world, including neighboring countries.

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
