MoHS Statement on Novel Coronavirus (27 February 2020, 8:15PM) (Link) (Unofficial translation by OCHA)

1. Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has been spreading in 34 countries including China, and the World Health Organization (WHO) updated as below (as of 15:30 Myanmar Standard Time on 27 February 2019).

Countries with high cases are China, South Korea, Italy, Japan, Iran and Singapore.

- 3. There were a total of 42 patients 12 in Yangon Region, 11 in Shan State, 8 in Mandalay Region and 11 in other states/regions.
- 4. The MoHS has been speeding up on monitoring and preventive measures on COVID-19, in cooperation with other relevant ministries, and national and international organizations.
- 5. In the preventive measures on COVID-19, the MoHS has been purchasing and delivering Intensive Care Unit (ICU), Isolation Ward, medicines and medical equipments as required, and connected and coordinated with local/internationa organizations and donors.
- 6. **For the public awareness and health education on COVID-19**, the MoHS has published posters, pamphlets, stickers and billboards, and delivered to different places of regions and states. Online publications can also be available at the links below;

More than 370,000 users have reached the links through QR Codes so far. In ddition, the MoHS has been broadcasting health information and education on State-run media and radios, including in ethnic languages.

- 7. Despite no confirmed cases of COVID-19 as of now in the country, Myanmar could also face immediate outbreak just like South Korea, Iran and Italy.
- 8. Despite no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Myanmar;
 - (a) people are advised to avoid going to crowded places and mass gatherings,
 - (b) people should hold such public gatherings only when not inevitable, and

- (c) when holding inevitably, people should follow the health guidelines by the MoHS, given the facts below;
 - Cases in other countries shows that new cases were found with or without contacts with the people tested positive for COVID-19 or no recent travels to the countries with cases
 - Risk of spreading from the people tested positive for COVID-19 or the people who have not showed any symptoms.
 - High risk of outbreaks in Myanmar.
