Job purpose

The ICRC Logistics Unit in Yangon is looking for a Dispatcher. Under the supervision of Vehicle Fleet Manager, the Dispatcher is responsible for assigning vehicles in a way that prioritizes safety, operational objectives, and cost efficiency. They carefully organize driver schedules to ensure all assignments align with the organization's needs and timelines. Additionally, they coordinate the maintenance of all vehicles, including generators and motorbikes, to keep them in optimal working condition.

Main responsibilities

- Coordinate and manage all aspects of the vehicle fleet to meet operational needs, ensuring optimal vehicle utilization, timely maintenance, and compliance with ICRC standards.
- Strategically plan and assign vehicle movements, ensuring proper documentation, vehicle readiness, and real-time trip tracking, including route deviations and field <u>deployment coordination</u>.
- Manage driver teams across all vehicle categories, overseeing licensing, duty schedules, attendance, and adherence to safety protocols and legal requirements.
- Lead the PMD process for drivers, conduct regular team meetings, maintain updated job descriptions, and support staff development through coaching and training opportunities.
- Enforce strict adherence to internal policies and traffic laws, ensure mandatory seatbelt use, and supervise correct vehicle loading practices to maintain safety standards.
- Track vehicle usage, fuel consumption, and servicing schedules; compile weekly reports for logistics and coordinate fuel procurement.
- Supervise vehicle and equipment maintenance (including generators and motorbikes), ensuring timely servicing and repairs according to manufacturer standards.
- Assist with vehicle registration, insurance claims, and accident reports while supporting documentation for per diems, advances, and overtime.
- Maintain accurate records including logbooks, trip documents, and monthly mileage reports, submitting data to relevant departments.
- Report schedule deviations, incidents, and road safety changes promptly to the line manager and ensure communication protocols are followed in the field.

Requirements and experience

- A university degree in a relevant field (such as logistics, administration, or operations management) or an equivalent combination of education and professional experience.
- A minimum of two years of proven work experience in a related field, ideally involving dispatch, fleet coordination, or logistics operations.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills, with fluency in both English and Myanmar, essential for effective coordination and reporting.
- Demonstrated ability to interact professionally with diverse teams and external stakeholders, ensuring clear and respectful communication.
- Previous experience with the ICRC, especially in areas such as fleet management, is a valuable asset and highly regarded.
