NFI: NFIs distribution took places in three areas in Amarapura township, Sin Kar Stadium (327 HH), Aung Chan Thar Pagoda compound (28 HH) and Ta Line Su village (90HH). **Shelter:** A total of (2410) tarpaulin are distributed to the affected community for the emergency shelter. (5) Tarpaulin each was supported to Myoma Mosque and RC Church which are also affected by earthquake. ( 57) Shelter tool kit are distributed to the affected community at Min Lan Ward.

**NFIs:** A total of 114 HH ( M (264), F (334) 598 people from Min Lan Ward are distributed (114) Dignity kit, (104) Individual kit, ( 2 ) Clean Delivery Kit, (8) Infant Kit, (21) Psychosocial Support Kit, (61) Blanket, ( 114) Mosquito net, ( 114) Slipper, ( 114) Plastic Box, (114) Jerry Can, (57 ) Shelter Tool Kit. These household from Ward were reviewed door to door visit previously

**Shelter :** A total of 30 tarpaulins were distributed to earthquake-affected households at Nursing and Midwifery School in Za Bu Thiri township to address urgent shelter needs. Additionally, a total of 150 blankets and a total of 20 folding beds have been donated to the 1000 bedded general hospital.

### (2.6) Local Red Cross Volunteers Activities

In the earthquake-impacted regions of Mandalay Region, Sagaing Region, Bago Region, Nay Pyi Taw, and Shan State, local volunteers are collaborating with relevant authorities and Local organizations to conduct relief operations.

**The ongoing efforts include:** First aid Service, Emergency medical transfers of critically injured patients to hospitals/clinics, MHPSS, RFL, Blood Donation, water distribution and sanitating, waste management, Shelter Set up, food and cash distribution management of donations from local donor to affected communities

## **(5) Challenges and Basic Need Items**

### **(5.1) Challenges**

- Operational Challenges: Limited road access slowing down response efforts.
- Staffing Issues: Need for additional logistics and finance personnel.
- Because of heavy rain and windy untimely, affected peoples, deployed RCVs and field staff were without safe areas
- Limitation of WASH related items available in Mandalay market
- No major challenges have been encountered in responding to the earthquake. However, affected communities continue to face limited access to drinking and domestic water, as well as insufficient access to latrines. The affected households also need kitchen sets.

### **(5.2) Mostly Requested from the Branches**

- ORS, Water Purified, Food
- Tarpaulins, Mosquito Nets, Hygiene Materials, Shelter, RCVs Safety Materials
- Health Care Services, First Aid Kits, MHPSS
- Solar panel for light

### **(5.3) Urgent Needs**

- More shelter materials to meet growing demand
- Water distribution and WASH activities especially emergency latrines
- Enhanced Camp Managements
- Generator for WASH Teams
- Urgent Need Difficulties to hiring the vehicle for the transportation of food and NFI
- 2- Security Guard for Main Water Distribution station at River bank.

- Health education sessions in camps/sites
